

# T3DD07

## Survey results

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### Introduction

Of the 100 registered persons 99 reached the conference location. As not everyone of them has participated on the after-event-survey, the following answers are reflecting just the opinion of the ones that filled in the survey form.

### About the participants

69 persons have finished the survey of which 3 (4.3%) where female and 66 (95.7%) where male. 15 (21.7%) of the results where given the same day as the survey was announced by mail. The participant's age ranged between 18 and 52 years with an average age of 30.04 years.

The occupation of our participants distributed as follows:

35	employees	50.7%
16	run their own company	23.2%
12	freelancer	17.4%
6	students	8.7 %

43 (62.3%) of them got their attendance paid by their company, 22 (31.9%) paid it from their own money and 4 (5.8%) got sponsored by someone else (parents?).

Participants came from all over the world! That's really true: We had guests from Japan, Slovakia and Latvia. Many attendees came from Germany, Switzerland, Netherlands, Austria and Denmark and one from Italy.

We go on with the statistic about the travel distance:

7	< 1 hour	10.1%

66 (95.7%) found this distance acceptable, just 3 (4.3%) were not happy with the length of their journey.

49 (71.0%) had a look into the map before they arrived in Dietikon, and 49 (71.0%) have read the directions.

Now let's switch from the participants to the event itself:

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### About the event

The event itself got rated with an average of 8.43 out of 10 points. 52 (75.4%) of this years participants will come back and participate on T3DD08, other 16 (23.2%) don't know it yet. One said that he/she will not come next year (1.4%).
